

CITY OF WATTERSON PARK

LEGISLATIVE MEETING

Jefferson County Farm Bureau • 4200 Gardiner View Avenue • Louisville, Kentucky 40213

September 12, 2012

The meeting was called to order at 7:00 p.m.

Roll Call — Roll was called. Present were Mayor Norman Liebert; Councilpeople Helen Arnold, Linda Chesser, Mary Ann Liebert, Joseph Welsh, Marlene Welsh and Lillian Wild; Treasurer Jerry Wild; and Clerk Aggie Keefe.

Pledge of Allegiance — All present recited the Pledge of Allegiance.

Minutes — A motion was made by Mrs. Arnold and seconded by Mrs. Liebert to approve the minutes of the August 8, 2012, meeting as received. All present voted yes (6-0).

Treasurer's Report — Mr. Wild reported revenues for the month of August in the amount of \$36,305.48 with expenditures in the amount of \$70,257.39, giving a deficit in the amount of \$33,951.91. Mr. Wild noted that the amount for road repairs was inadvertently listed under Office Supplies & Expense but should have been listed under Public Works. The amount under Expenses for General Government should be \$7,489.09 and under Expenses for Public Works should be \$58,290.10. Mr. Welsh made a motion to amend the report per Mr. Wild's instructions; seconded by Mrs. Welsh; all present voted yes (6-0). Mr. Welsh made a motion to approve the report as amended; seconded by Mrs. Welsh; all present voted yes (6-0).

Theft — Larry Korfhage, a resident from 4313 Annshire, was present. He wanted to make us aware that there had been a theft of a concrete lion from his yard. He said the lion is one of a pair that has been in his yard for 32 years. He has posted signs throughout the City asking for information regarding the theft. He asked if Watterson Park could offer a reward for information leading to the arrest of the individual or individuals involved. This is something that we would need to discuss with our attorney before making a decision. In the meantime, we will post the notice on our website on the Citizens Corner page.

Merchant Association — Jim Denny, a resident on Larkmoor Lane, was present to address the Council. He is interested in starting a merchant association that would include businesses in Watterson Park. He has already spoken with the St. Matthews Business Association and the Bashford Manor Neighborhood Association, among others. He would like for it to be a coordinated effort with the City of Watterson Park as well. Council gave Mr. Denny our support and asked him to keep us informed.

OLD BUSINESS

Pocket Calendars — Mayor Liebert reported that the pocket calendars have been received and will be delivered sometime in November to residents, including the Bluegrass Mobile Home Park.

Illegal Parking — Mrs. Chesser reported that cars are still parking illegally at the Awnings Above property. She will contact Metro again to issue a complaint.

Climb-Axe Property — Mrs. Chesser sent a letter to Mayor Fischer regarding the Climb-Axe property but hasn't yet received a response. She will follow up and report to us at the next meeting.

Stray Cats — Mrs. Chesser will call Animal Control regarding the stray cats at 4250 Regina Lane.

Kentucky League of Cities Conference — Mrs. Chesser will see if she can get hotel reservations for the conference for her and Mrs. Arnold and if so, they will attend.

Low Wire on Regina Lane — Mayor Liebert called LG&E regarding the low wire on Regina Lane and they determined that it is a cable line. Mrs. Chesser agreed to call Insight to report it.

Verst Group —

Mrs. Arnold reported that the Verst Group installed a wood fence between their property at Stober Road and cleaned up the property.

Mayor Liebert reported that semis are still parking and leaving their motors running on the Verst Group property at 1234 Gardiner Lane. The resident at the end of Regina Lane next to the Verst Group property has complained about the noise, the smell, and possible safety issues. Mayor Liebert will call Verst Group to complain. In addition, Mrs. Liebert, Mrs. Chesser and Mrs. Welsh will each call the Air Pollution Control Board to complain.

Paving Project — Mayor Liebert reported that the striping of City streets has been completed.

Property on Regina Lane — Mrs. Chesser reported that Mr. Treitz had checked on the vacant property at 4350 Regina Lane and found out that the previous owner, Donna Robertson, passed away and did not leave a will. Her surviving three children all live out of town. Mayor Liebert will contact Mr. Treitz to find out what we should do to get the property cleaned up.

NEW BUSINESS




