Enforcement of this Code is carried out by the Code Enforcement Staff of the Department of Codes and Regulations. If a portable sign is found on property that does not conform to the guidelines contained in this Chapter, the Responsible Party (Owner and/or Tenant) will be cited. Failure of the Responsible Party to remove the sign may result in criminal court action and/or confiscation of the sign.

Signs Along Scenic Corridors and Parkway

No billboards, temporary, portable or outdoor advertising signs (such as signs located on transit benches) shall be permitted on any property or within any development site or parkway buffer adjacent to a designated parkway or scenic corridor (LDC, Chapter 8.6.2).

Penalties

Penalty for illegal signs may include civil fines or from \$100-\$1000 per day of violation and a criminal complaint may be filed in Jefferson District Court. If convicted you will be subject to a fine or imprisonment as provided by law.

There are several subcategories of **Portable Signs**.

Small Freestanding

Business Signs

Only one Small Freestanding Sign is permitted on premises located in C-N, C-1, C-2, C-M only. Examples of this type of sign is "sandwich board" or "A frame" signs.

To ensure that your **Small Freestanding Business Sign** is in compliance with the law, please check the following guidelines:

- Cannot exceed 12 square feet per face
- No more than 2 faces per sign
- · Cannot be over 4 feet tall
- Must only advertise the business and/or products on site
- Display is limited to hours of operation
- Cannot be illuminated
- Cannot have any electrical components
- Cannot be displayed in public right-ofway or public easement unless it is properly permitted by the Department of Public Works
- Cannot interfere with vehicular or pedestrian traffic
- Must be kept in good repair
- Must be kept clean, free from weeds and rubbish

Temporary Freestanding

Business Signs

One Temporary Freestanding Business Sign may be permitted in lieu of a permanent freestanding business sign with a permit in C-1, C-2, C-M, M-1, M-2, M-3 and EZ-1 districts only. (Exception: Suburban Marketplace Corridor.) This type of sign may be displayed a maximum of 120 days per year.

The following criteria must be adhered to when displaying a Temporary Freestanding Business Sign:

- Must have a valid permit
- Cannot exceed 32 square feet per face
- No more than 2 faces per sign
- Cannot be over 6 feet tall
- Must only advertise the business and/or products on site or religious, charitable or non-commercial messages
- May be illuminated if electrical components are UL approved and connected to a ground fault interrupter
- Illuminated signs may not flash and must be constant in intensity and color
- All components must be non-moving and stationary
- Cannot be displayed in the public rightof-way or public easement
- Cannot interfere with vehicular or pedestrian traffic

Refer to Chapter 8 of the Land Development Code for each zoning district, if the proposed sign is located in one of the following districts:

- Any Local Preservation District
- Downtown Development Overlay District
- 0 Bardstown Road Overlay District
- Waterfront Development Area
- 6 Gene Snyder Corridor
- 0 Any Parkway or Scenic Corridor

Temporary Banner Signs

Permits must be affixed to the sign. Only one Temporary Banner is allowed on any business premise. The size of a banner cannot exceed 50% of the allowed sign area for that building. Temporary Banners may only be displayed for 30 days at a time per permit, for a total of 90 days per calendar year. Upon expiration of the permit, the banner must be removed. Temporary Banners may only be attached to permanent structures (canopies & buildings).

Temporary Banners made of cloth, plastic or

other soft material are allowed with a permit.

Special Event Sign

One **Special Event Sign** is permitted for institutional uses with the **proper permit**. Permits are valid for 120 days per calendar year. The expiration date of the permit must be affixed and visible at all times.

All **Special Event Signs** must conform to the following guidelines:

- Must not exceed 32 square feet per face
- No more than 2 faces per sign
- Cannot be over 6 feet tall
- May be illuminated if electrical components are UL approved and connected to a ground fault interrupter
- Illuminated signs may not flash and must be constant in intensity and color
- All components must be non-moving and stationary
- Cannot be displayed in the public rightof-way or public easement
- Cannot interfere with vehicular or pedestrian traffic
- Must be kept in good repair
- Small special event signs not to exceed 4 square feet are allowed without a permit and must be removed 3 days after the event
