MSD: How You Can Help

- Decrease the use of fertilizer and pesticides, especially when it may rain soon. Stormwater picks up these chemicals and carries them to our local waterways, where fertilizer fosters algae and pesticides harm our local flora and fauna.
- Compost grass clippings. Grass clippings get carried off by rain water and can clog catch basins, drainage ditches and streams, contributing to local flooding.
- Wash your car on the grass. Your vehicle carries oil, grit, and dirt from the roadways where you drive. When you wash your car on a paved surface, the water drains to a nearby catch basin or drainage ditch and can be carried to a nearby creek or stream. In the yard, water will soak into the grass, so less will run off to catch basins or drainage ditches.
- Put pet waste in the trash. Pet waste that is left on the ground is carried to local waterways when it rains and can possibly contaminate our rivers and streams.

Benefits of living in Watterson Park...

As a resident or business owner in Watterson Park, you might wonder what the property taxes you pay actually fund. So I thought I'd list some of the many benefits afforded to you as a resident or business owner in the City of Watterson Park.

- Lower property taxes for businesses and residents, with a current tax rate of 8.2¢ per \$100 of assessed valuation.
- **Private police patrol** through Kentuckiana Law Enforcement for residential streets as well as businesses to enhance the service provided through the Metro Louisville Police Department.
- Sanitation, recycle, and year-round yard waste pick-up for residences.
- Road and sidewalk paving and maintenance.
- **Tree planting and maintenance**, including removal of dead/fallen trees, on City-owned property and rights-of-way.
- Snow removal from streets and pre-treatment with brine when ice is forecast.
- Lawn maintenance on rights-of-way and on City-owned properties.
- **Spraying and cleaning gutters** along Gardiner Lane, Bishop Lane, and various other streets.
- Installation of and monthly fees for **street lights**, including acorn lights.
- Installation of special decorative street signs throughout the City.
- Building and maintenance of the **signature entrance** at Newburg Road and Bishop Lane; installation of **boundary signs** throughout the City.
- City-sponsored annual trip for residents to coordinate with our Master Tree Plan
- Organized participation in Operation Brightside spring and fall cleanups.
- Installation and maintenance of speed humps on residential streets where warranted.
- Active participation in **zoning applications and hearings** to ensure any new zoning will have a positive impact upon our City.
- Construction and maintenance of the **Lillian R. Wild Walking Path**, providing a safe, comfortable place to walk, sit, and/or reflect.

HOW TO REDUCE YARD WASTE

The best way to reduce the need for collection and improve your yard is to follow the **Love 'Em and Leave 'Em (LELE)** practice of using your yard waste as fertilizer.

LELE Tips & Tricks:

Set your mower to maximum height. Follow the one-third rule: never cut more than one-third of the total height of the grass when you mow.

Don't bag those clippings! Leaves and grass break down rapidly, releasing nutrients back into your soil.

Mulch leaves and landscape trimmings into your lawn. Mow over landscape trimmings and leaves without a grass catcher. To avoid hazards while mowing, make sure trimmings are no larger than a pencil.

Start composting! With your own compost bin or pile, you can recycle food scraps and yard waste into usable compost for your flower beds, gardens, potted plants, or other landscaping.

It's Grass-Cutting Season

Please don't leave grass clippings on the sidewalk or blow them into the street. These clippings can stop up the storm drains, preventing them from working properly. The clippings can also get into cracks in the street and sidewalk, causing grass and weeds to grow in them.

In addition, a traffic safety hazard can result when grass clippings are blown onto the streets. Freshly cut grass is slippery, which can cause a bicyclist or motorcyclist to lose traction and possibly crash. And once the clippings get wet from rain, that hazard is compounded.

Thank you for doing your part to ensure that your neighborhood is clean and safe, and to preserve and enhance home values in our City.
