Your City Council and Officers have been extremely busy since our last newsletter.

- We finished the paving project on Champions Trace.
- We hired a new auditor, who completed our audit for fiscal year ending June 30, 2017.
- We worked with CBRE Leasing/Iron Mountain to repair the damaged fence at the end of Larkmoor Lane.
- We installed speed humps on Champions Trace Lane, Annshire Avenue, Conaem Drive, and Regina Avenue.
- We secured bids for sanitation for July 1, 2018, through June 30, 2020, and awarded the contract to Rumpke Sanitation. (See insert for details.)
- We participated as a City in the annual Brightside Spring Clean-up.
- We ordered boundary signs to better delineate our City limits; in addition, we installed street signs where needed.
- We secured and signed contracts for mowing, snow removal, and mulching and trimming trees.
- We organized our annual community yard sale.
- We applied for and received recertification as a Tree City USA from the Arbor Day Foundation.
- We organized a trip to Cincinnati Zoo to complement our forestry program.
- We passed a budget ordinance for fiscal year July 1, 2018, through June 30, 2019.

An average American generates nearly one ton of trash a year, but all that waste does not have to go to the landfill. Rumpke has made significant investments in recycling technology to make recycling easy and convenient at your home.


Rumpke's program, called single stream recycling, allows all recyclables to be mixed together, and it is sorted at one of Rumpke's advanced recycling facilities. Single stream programs focus on all recyclable materials generated by residents – not just individual items. This comprehensive approach helps divert the greatest volume of recyclable materials from landfills.

## **Tribute to former Mayor Norman Liebert**



This spring, your City Council recognized former Mayor Norman Liebert by dedicating the green space at the Lillian Wild Walking Path to him. We installed a plaque at that location honoring his 34 years of esteemed service to our City. Norm served as Mayor from 1981 to 2015. Under his leadership, Watterson Park residents and businesses enjoyed an increased level of services, including free sanitation services, lower property tax rates, road paving and repair, snow plowing, improved street lights, and an excellent forestry program.



### **Keys to good TREE pruning**

Begin visual inspection at the top of the tree and work downward.

Use The 1/3 and 1/4 Rules of Pruning:

- Never remove more than 1/4 of a tree's crown in a season
- Ideally, main side branches should be at least 1/3 smaller than the diameter of the trunk.
- For most deciduous (broadleaf) trees, don't prune up from the bottom any more than 1/3 of the tree's total height.
- Where possible, try to encourage side branches that form angles that are 1/3 off vertical that form "10 o'clock" or "2 o'clock" angles with the trunk.

For most species, the tree should have a single trunk. Identify the best leader and later branches before you begin pruning and remove defective parts before pruning for form.

Don't worry about protecting pruning cuts. For aesthetics, you may feel better painting large wounds but it doesn't prevent or reduce decay.

Keep tools sharp. One-hand pruning shears with curved blades work best on young trees

For high branches use a pole pruner. A major job on a big tree should be done by a professional arborist.

For larger branches, cut outside the branch bark and ridge collar (swollen area). Do not leave a protruding stub. If the limb is too small to have formed a collar cut close.

When simply shortening a small branch, make the cut at a lateral bud or another lateral branch. Favor a bud that will produce a branch that will grow in desired direction (usually outward). The cut should be sharp and clean and made at a slight angle about ¼ inch beyond the bud.
